Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord!

Wow! It's hard to believe that the school year is upon us once again!

This year confirmation instruction will be on Monday evenings at 4:00 pm, starting on September 10. Please let me know immediately if there will be a scheduling problem.

It is my privilege to be the instructor for seventh confirmation class. Although it is the duty of the parents to see that their child is raised in the faith, Grace Lutheran Church and School, assists in helping parents fulfill it through additional instruction.

This instruction is designed to clarify elementary Christian doctrine and teach the basic skills of discipleship and spiritual discipline, which include...

- Bible study
- Prayer
- Worship
- Witness
- Service
- Community
- Family Living
- Leadership

Requirements are:

- Memory—assigned Bible passages
- Journal—notes of readings and class work in a Composition Notebook (provided)
- Classwork—homework, essays, quizzes, tests, videos
- Participation—prepared, meaningful participation in classroom discussions

In order to practice their faith, your child will also be required to:

- Attend a worship every week
- Summarize 30 of the pastor's sermons
- Submit at one page typed statement of their personal faith at the end of their two years of study
- Participate in an oral dialog with the Pastor prior to the May confirmation ceremony at the end of eighth grade

- Participate meaningfully in the life of the church, such as youth group, VBS, assisting with Sunday school, assisting with fellowship events, participate in one or more church committee activities, participate in the choir or bell choir, and (required) participate in the worship service as an acolyte

The primary instructional materials are derived from Luther's Small Catechism, which covers:

- The Ten Commandments
- The Apostles' Creed
- The Lord's Prayer
- Baptism
- Holy Communion
- Office of the Keys (Confession and Absolution)

It is expected that this is not a final Bible class, but rather sets the foundation for a lifetime of study and practice in the Christian faith. To that end, we have a Youth Group program that continues modeling the Christian faith and life, while having many engaging activities and helping serve in the church.

I previously taught High School and College while in seminary, so I promise that no child will be left behind and no question will be left unanswered (unless the Bible is silent on that question). The material is not that difficult, and uses handouts, interactive lectures and discussion, assigned readings, videos and, of course, the Bible—all of which will be peppered with humor, honest answers and love.

Parents are sincerely encouraged to also grow in their faith by attending one of the many Bible studies offered here at Grace—or you can attend the six-week adult confirmation class offered three times a year for six weeks at a time following Sunday worship. We will have an eye toward you being able to master the basics of the Christian faith to help you in the faith formation of your child.
